Emergency Card

All children diagnosed with cancer will be given a blue emergency card. This will give direct access to the Paediatric Department at any time of the day or night without having to go via the Emergency Department.

The Shared Care System

Children and young people diagnosed with cancer need the help of a variety of health professionals to diagnose and treat their condition. This treatment can occur in specialised Paediatric Oncology Centres, Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Units and the Community. We call this the "Shared Care System".

Shared Care enables your child to receive some aspects of their care as close to home as possible or within the home environment when appropriate.

What is a Multidisciplinary Team?

The Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Unit at the Whittington Hospital is run by a multidisciplinary team.

A multidisciplinary team (MDT) is a group of health professionals with expertise in cancer in children and young people, who work together to manage a child or young person's care. People with cancer receive the most effective treatment when different specialists work together.

The Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Unit MDT meets on a monthly basis to discuss the cases and treatment of children under their care.

Who is in the Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Unit MDT?

Key Worker

The Key Worker will be your main point of contact within the hospital. She is here to support you and your child and is responsible for co-ordinating your child's care.
