Welcome to Nightingale ward

Welcome to Nightingale Ward. The aim of this leaflet is to give you some information about what you can expect while a patient in this ward.

Nightingale Ward is a 23 bedded ward. The ward provides care for patients with respiratory diseases admitted under the care of the Respiratory Team.

General information

There is the hospital restaurant, muffin break café and an Italian bistro and a shop on the first floor of the hospital where you and your visitors can go for tea/coffee and food. It is important that you make sure you tell a member of staff if you are going to leave the ward for a period of time.

It is important that if possible you send home any valuable jewellery or personal valuables such as money, bank cards etc. If this is not possible please make sure that you give these items to a member of Nursing staff who will ensure they are safely stored in the hospital safe and that you are given a receipt. We will ensure you have your valuables returned to you before you are discharged home.

Visiting

It is very important that while you are in hospital you get adequate rest to aid your recovery. We therefore ask that you advise your family, relatives and friends to only come to visit you during the allocated visiting times only.

Visiting hours are: Monday – Sunday 14:00pm - 20:00pm

Protected mealtimes

We have a scheme that is known as protected meal times. This means that while you are having your meal as far as possible ward staff will ensure that you are not disturbed by visitors, doctors or other staff unless absolutely necessary.

We will please ask your visitors not to visit between 12:30pm – 13:30pm to allow all patients sufficient quiet time to eat and enjoy their lunch.
