## Inclusion Criteria (Conditions):

All children referred MUST have one of the following working diagnoses and be known to a Whittington Consultant.

- Gastroenteritis
- Resolving Sepsis (discharged from CAU or (ard)

ward)

- Infections requiring IV antibiotics
- Cellulitis
- Periorbital Cellulitis
- Pneumonia
- Infected Eczema

• Feeding: Transition to bolus feeds/normal feeding (Typically discharged from ward)

• Babies with jaundice discharged from ward or Paediatric Emergency Department or on the midwifery referral pathway.

- Croup
- Asthma exacerbation
- Viral Induced Wheeze
- Diarrhea and vomiting

• Long term condition plus **viral upper** respiratory tract infection (e.g. congenital cardiac condition+ URTI where feeding or breathing maybe affected)

- Bronchiolitis
- Febrile convulsion
- Neonate with feeding difficulties

Any diagnoses not on this list will be considered after discussion with the Hospital at Home nurses on shift.
