

FoI request re: Admissions patients over 65

Ref: 21-JB-1103

Thank you for your request for information relating to the number of admissions for patients over 65.

This was received on 11 February 2021 and has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Please find our responses below:

Request:

In your NHS Trust, monthly from January 2015 to December 2020, how many emergency admissions were recorded for

- a) people over 65 and
- b) people over 65 with dementia overall and separately with
- a fall
- a Urinary Tract Infection
- Delirium
- Dehydration
- Gastroenteritis
- Influenza
- Chest Infections/ Pneumonia
- Ear, nose or throat infections

as their primary reason for emergency admission, and for each category how many were care home residents, ideally broken down by LA, NHS or Private?

Please note the data source is subject to some uncertainty due to how information is inputted.

The Dementia alert code used to identify dementia patients may include patients who no longer have an active alert.

Patients diagnosed with dementia during their inpatient spell may not have had a dementia alert code inputted. Therefore the actual dementia figures may not be a true representation; however this is the recorded information we have.

In regards to the source of admission, we are unable to distinguish between a patient's address and that of a care home registered as the patient's address.
