## **Databases Content Coverage**

**AMED**: The Allied and Complementary Medicine Database (AMED) is a bibliographic database covering a selection of journals in complementary medicine, palliative care, and several professions allied to medicine.

**CINHAL**: The CINAHL<sup>®</sup> database is a comprehensive and authoritative source of information for nurses, allied health professionals, and others interested in health care. CINAHL covers all aspects of nursing and allied health disciplines. CINAHL's annually updated thesaurus is adapted from the US National Library of Medicine's Medical Subject Headings (MeSH). There are over 4000 unique nursing and allied health subject headings.

**CINAHL** Complete: CINAHL®Complete is the definitive research tool for nursing and allied health professionals. Barts Health staff can get fast and easy full-text access to top journals, evidence-based care sheets, quick lessons and more. CINAHL®Complete provides broad content coverage including 50 nursing specialties, speech and language pathology, nutrition, general health and medicine. Content includes over 6 million records with full text for more than 1,200 journals and further indexing for nearly 5,500 journals. Complete is the definitive research tool for all areas of nursing & allied health literature.

**EMBASE**: Embase (Excerpta Medica Database) is a biomedical and pharmacological database containing more than 30 million records including articles from more than 8,500 journals. It is especially strong in its coverage of drug and pharmaceutical research, pharmacology and toxicology.

**EMCARE**: EMCARE covers all nursing specialties and nursing healthcare professions. Includes international coverage of allied health, education and training, development and management, midwifery, health and healthcare economics, clinical medical and healthcare social work, psychiatry and mental health, and traumatology, emergency and critical-care medicine.

**MEDLINE**: MEDLINE<sup>®</sup> is a bibliographic database produced by the U.S. National Library of Medicine. The database contains millions of citations, derived from thousands of biomedical and life science journals extending back to 1946. Indexed with Medical Subject Headings (MeSH<sup>®</sup>) from the NLM controlled vocabulary.

**PsychInfo**: This database is published by the American Psychological Associations and provides comprehensive indexing and abstracts of the international psychological literature from the 1800s to the present. Documents indexed include journals, articles, books, dissertations and more. 90% of the 3,000+ titles indexed in PsycINFO are peer-reviewed.
