DISCHARGE INFORMATION FOLLOWING A GASTROSCOPY AND COLONOSCOPY

Recovery

If you received sedation, it is important that you rest for the remainder of the day and have someone to stay with you overnight as these medications can affect your focus or sense of balance. During the first 24 hours following sedation you must not:

- ✓ drink alcohol
- √ drive any vehicles (including riding a motorcycle or bicycle)
- ✓ take sleeping tablets
- ✓ operate machinery or electrical items (including a cooker or kettle)
- ✓ sign any legally binding or important documents
- ✓ work at heights (including climbing ladders or onto chairs)

Eating and drinking

You may eat and drink normally and resume your normal medication after you leave the department, unless you are instructed otherwise by the consultant performing your procedure.

You may experience sore throat and feel bloated for a few hours, but this will settle. You may find helpful massaging your tummy, having warm drinks or walking around to pass the wind.

Please bear in mind that your bowel has been completely emptied and you should not expect to have normal bowel functions for two or three days.

When to seek advice

You may find traces of blood coming from your back passage if biopsies were taken or polyps were removed. If you have continuous or worsening bleeding (fresh blood or dark stools), fever, severe pain in your neck, chest or abdomen or persisting vomiting, please <u>attend the nearest emergency department</u> and bring a copy of the endoscopy report with you.
